

1. *Formation Signs.*
 - (a) On N/S from mudguard or equivalent position.
 - (b) On rear of the vehicle in a prominent position.
 - (c) Not on motor-cycles.

2. *Unit Signs.* (431/51, a/b 646/51.)
 - (a) Approximately $9\frac{1}{2}$ inches high and $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide.
 - (b) Vehicles—on front, on O/S, and O/S of tail board.
 - (c) Motor cycles—on each forward end of gasoline tank.
 - (d) Not on trailers.

3. *Tactical signs.* (431/51, a/b 646/51.)
 - (a) Armoured Units:
 - (i) A.F.V's—front/hull sides and rear of turret.
 - (ii) "A" Vehicles without turrets and "B" vehicles—on front, sides and rear.
 - (b) Other Units:

On front and rear, but must not interfere with other signs.

4. *Commanders and Staff Signs.*
 - (a) On rear O/S of body, 6 inches above rear wing.
 - (b) Approximate size, 10 inches \times 6 inches \times $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches.
 - (c) Illuminated window front and rear.
 - (d) The signs may be improvised from 1-gallon oil tins or similar container.

5. *Distinctive Markings on General Officer's and Brigadiers' Vehicles.* (438/47.)
 - (a) All general Officers and officers holding the appointment of brigadier will, by virtue of their status, carry stars at the front and rear of the military vehicles in which they are travelling as follows:—

Field Marshal	Five stars in a horizontal line.
General	Four stars in a horizontal line.
Lieutenant-General	Three stars in a horizontal line.
Major-General	Two stars in a horizontal line.
Brigadier	One star.
 - (b) The issue of star plates appropriate to their rank is authorized on a scale of one pair to each general officer and brigadier on the establishment of Commands both overseas and at home.
 - (c) Sealed patterns of these emblems are held by the (War Office Ord. 13). Local production is not authorized.

6. *Speed Limit Signs.* (431/51, a b 646/51.)

Speed limit signs will be suspended, except for vehicle restricted by A.C.I. 378/49, to a 20 m.p.h. speed limit. Such vehicles will bear the authorized marking.
